



HIGH SCHOOL PROFILE: 2020-2021

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COMMUNITY AND HISTORY

Haleakalā Waldorf School is a K-12 private school located in Makawao, Hawai'i. A Maui-based learning community, HWS is located on two campuses: the Kealahou Campus in Kula for early childhood education through 8th grade, and the Kaluanui Campus at the Hui No'eau Visual Arts Center in Makawao for 9-12th grade students. Students come from the surrounding rural communities of Ha'iku, Pa'ia, Makawao, Kula, and Pukalani, as well as from the more suburban communities of Kihei, Wailuku, and Kahului. Our diverse student body reflects our small island community culturally and ethnically, as well as socio-economically.

In the fall of 2013, HWS expanded to include a high school, opening its doors with 23 students through the 9th and 10th grades. Currently, there are 50 students in grades 9-12. This academic school year marks our eighth year in existence and our sixth graduating class.

Waldorf education is the world's largest private non-sectarian movement. At its core, it fosters in each student the capacity for moral and critical thinking. Its interdisciplinary approach cultivates a lifelong love of learning. The Haleakalā Waldorf School offers a rigorous academic and arts-infused curriculum, K - 12, designed to educate the entire human being: mind, body, and heart. Waldorf graduates consistently demonstrate a high level of active engagement and achievement in their communities and in the post-secondary programs of study they enter. Waldorf graduates earn credits which exceed the minimum requirements for college admissions.

ACCREDITATION

Haleakalā Waldorf School is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), Hawaii Association of Independent Schools (HAIS), and by the Association of Waldorf Schools of North America (AWSNA), of which it is a full member.

EXPLANATION OF CREDITS

The Haleakalā Waldorf School uses a mixed term schedule. The Carnegie unit is used as a basis for the course credit assignments; 1 credit = 1 unit year of coursework.

Credits are awarded as follows:

Main Lessons (3-week blocks) = 0.25 credit

Quarter Courses (5 periods/week) = 0.25 credit

Semester Courses (FL, Math) = 0.50 credit
